LOOKING FOR Cats with seizures

Studying cause and effect of seizures on the brain in cats

The Study

This study investigates the clinical signs and physical changes to the brain caused by seizures in cats.

Who Qualifies

Any cat patient with a history of epilepsy that is receiving end-of-life treatment at UW Veterinary Care.

What Happens

Patients enrolled in this study will undergo sample collection with imaging and microscopic evaluation following euthanasia.

Why Participate

Seizures in cats appear to be consistent with the most common type of epilepsy in humans, temporal lobe epilepsy (TLE). The aim of this study is to confirm that TLE occurs in cats, which will advance treatment options for cats with epilepsy.
