Class II Malocclusion

- Is there a gap between the front teeth when the mouth is closed?
- Is the lower fang tooth behind or inside the upper one?



Normal



Study Purpose

- This study is taking measurements of the jaw on a CT scan to look at ways to help dogs with overbites in the future.

Eligibility

- Class II malocclusion (overbite).
- One of the following breeds:
 - * Labrador retriever
 - * Golden retriever
 - * Standard poodle
 - * Labradoodle (standard size)
 - * Goldendoodle (standard size)
 - * German Shepherd Dog
- Dogs should be generally healthy

Incentives

- Free screening exam, bloodwork, and jaw CT scan. Over a \$750 value/dog!
- Helps future dogs!

Study Visits (2)

- Screening visit takes about 30 minutes. An oral exam and physical exam will be done to confirm eligibility. A small amount of blood will be collected for a CBC and chemistry.
- If eligible, a second visit will be scheduled within 30 days. Your dog will need to be dropped off for a few hours for a sedated CT scan of the jaw. Because this is only done with sedation, no other procedures (such as dental cleanings or mass removals) can be added.
